

Working at Height Policy

This policy covers the use of ladders and other equipment.

- **1.** The aim of this policy is to protect all volunteers from accident and injury when working at height within the church building or outside.
- 2. The policy seeks to implement the guidance of the HSE and will be reviewed annually prior to the AGM.
- **3.** No use of a ladder or other working at height equipment is to take place by one person working alone. A minimum of two people at all times.
- **4.** No use of a ladder or other working at height equipment is to take place without a risk assessment being done.
- **5.** Anyone using a ladder must read and sign a copy of the HSE INDG455 "Safe use of ladders and stepladders" prior to commencing work.
- **6.** All work using a tower must...
 - **a.** Be approved by the Leadership Team prior to commencement. In order for this to happen...
 - i. The check list must be completed and submitted to the Leadership Team for approval along with a signed and dated risk assessment.
 - **b.** One member of the working party must have completed the working at height training specified by the Leadership Team and only this person may ascend the tower.
 - **c.** All members of the working party must read and sign the "HSE Working at Height: A brief guide" before commencing work.
 - **d.** The Tower will only be unlocked by the H&S Officer or the Administrator on receipt of a completed checklist signed by two members of the Leadership Team and a copy of the "HSE Working at Height: A brief guide," signed by all members of the working party.
 - **e.** On completion of the work the tower is to be dismantled and stowed by the working party who then report to the H&S Officer or the Administrator.
 - **f.** The tower is then to be locked by the H&S Officer or the Administrator.
